Opening. F4GKR welcomed delegates and observers to the Final Plenary of the 26th General Conference of IARU Region 1.

The agenda for the meeting was approved.

The meeting agreed that the neutral term "chair" shall be used in all future IARU-R1 documents.

The chair of C6 explained the voting procedure during the Final plenary and EC voting.

Report and recommendations from C2 - Credentials and Finance Committee

The chair DL3MBG reported from the C2 work.

To avoid confusion at future conferences, it was suggested that the working procedure for documents presented to both C2 and C3 should be in the order; first discussed in C3, then to be discussed in C2 in relation to the budget. The suggestion was accepted by the meeting.

This Board could act as a steering committee to initiate only projects where there are available resources and at least two societies willing to contribute.
- Establishment of a "Shaping the Future" coordinator position dedicated to the initiative with the following tasks:
 - Identification of "projects and initiatives" contact points within the Member Societies,
 - Sharing and collection, via email and newsletters, of regular information on the projects undertaken in the societies. The objective here is to make known the work that has already been done and to encourage collaboration between the National Societies, to propose to unite efforts when the number of volunteers available is insufficient,
 - To help structure these projects to make them more effective and facilitate collaboration or funding by the IARU.
 - To accept OE3MZC as coordinator
- Considering our limited capacity to set up a "Marketing and Public Relation" plan to promote our hobby, we recommend the creation of a "liaison group" dedicated to these aspects where different Member Societies could work together with IARU and support from hired professionals.

<u>STARS</u>

PAOAGF reported about the workshop and meetings held during the conference. Presentation and minutes will be available in the STARS folder on the conference website.

General meeting remark

IARS requested respect for presented different views during the conference meetings discussions. Region 1 is large with different cultures and experiences and respect should be given to the speakers that take the floor.

Election of Executive Committee (EC) for 2023-2026

After the voting of the nomination of Z32TO, the unusual current situation is an exact number of nominations for the EC. As the constitution does not cover this situation, the proposed voting with the EC secret ballot vote in one step was proposed by the EBC (C6).

2026 IARU-R1 General Conference venue

After opening the agenda item, the chair asked the floor for comments regarding the length of the conference. Comments showed there are different opinions and no clear choice. While some have more difficult to be travelling for longer periods and recommend a 4-day conference, others prefer the longer conference with 5 days to allow for enough time for discussions.

Paper ZL23 C3 16, IARU conference

The paper was presented by OV. After discussion, the paper was revised and put forward to voting.

It is recommended that the following criteria are considered when hosting a conference:

- **1.** The venue of the conferences may not be more than one-and-a-half-hour drive from an international airport.
- 2. The hotel must be large enough and have rooms to accommodate all participants
- 3. It must have suitably sized conference rooms for all meetings.
- 4. Accessibility should be provided in all the rooms and facilities
- 5. High-capacity Wireless network is required in all rooms and facilities
- 6. Visa delays and procedures should be known and communicated in due time
- 7. Price for the IARU and for participants should be considered too

Proposed: HRS Seconded: NARL In favour: Unanimously

Next conference venue

The chair opened for presentation of the received three proposals for next conference venue:

- **ZL23_C3_61 OV proposal to host Conference 2026** OE1MCU presented the proposal of Vienna as venue for the next conference. First cost estimate per delegate around 1000 EUR.
- **ZL23_C3_62 RSM proposal to host Conference 2026** Z32TO presented the RSM proposal of Skopje as venue. Target is to be the cheapest conference ever.
- ZL23_C3_65 DARC proposal to host Conference 2026
 DL3MBG presented the DARC proposal of Landshut as venue.
 The 2017 IARU-R1 conference was held at this conference centre.
 Estimated costs 5d: 720, 6d: 820 EUR

According to the Byelaws/Standing Recommendations, when more than one proposal have been submitted, a first round of votes shall reduce the number of proposals to two. Then a second vote will be made between the two remaining proposals.

Séamus, born in 1948 holds a Bachelor of Engineering Degree from University College Dublin (UCD) and is awarded a Master of Engineering Degree for research on "Coherent demodulation methods for dsb and ssb signals" in 1972 by the University of Dublin.

After a career in industry he was an external examiner for the Computer Science Degree at the Technical University of Dublin (TUD)

He is licenced since 1967 as EI8BP.

Séamus is involved in the Irish Radio Transmitters Society (IRTS) at committee level for many years and became President from 2012-2015.

As President of the IRTS he took a particular interest in promoting amateur radio. He ran an outreach programme to teach children for several years focussing on the uses of radio and the construction of simple circuits. He also created a CD Guide for the Irish HAREC examination.

In 2015 he first became involved with IARU and represented IARU at the EMC Working Party what is now the Expert Group on Radio Equipment at the European Commission. He was member of the subgroup tasked with producing the Guide to the Radio Equipment Directive (RED).

He is Ireland's mentor for ARISS and was pleased to have organised a direct contact between local schools, TUD (Technical University of Dublin) and the ISS recently.

Séamus has served two full terms as Chairman of the Political Relations Committee (PRC) of IARU Region 1 until today.
